



# GUIDE OF PERMANENT RESIDENCE FOR WORKING VISA HOLDERS 2021

You might be thinking of applying for Permanent Residence in Japan and also work with. The permanent Residence is one of the goals for foreign citizens who want to live in Japan for life. When I open my office, I mainly handle general VISA application like Working VISA and Dependent VISA.

But After Covid-19 spread through the world, there are more contacts regarding getting Permanent Residence application in Japan. You could work in Japan if you have working VISA. But these VISA statuses will be influenced by your employment. You also have limitation on activity which you could do in Japan even through you come up with business idea which might be innovative for you and the society.

I think it is better for working VISA holders to have less restrictive environment to make their life better in terms of their life and career. Permanent Residence in Japan will be one of the best ways to get such environment. You could engage in any activity in Japan and get credit when you run your business from your business partners and banks.

Now my most of my clients are engineers who would like to buy their home in Japan or start business in Japan. Because of such situation, I made this document to explain how engineers could get Permanent Residency in Japan. We will expect that this book will be read by the people who is...

1. Working VISA holders who live in Japan with working VISA and consider for PR application
2. working VISA holders who live in Japan with Highly skilled professional VISA(高度専門職) and want to apply for PR in Japan.

I hope this documents will help you to start preparation for application of Permanent Residence in Japan.

## What is PR?



Permanent Residence is the permission which allow foreign citizens to live in Japan without Period of stay. Permanent Residents could live in Japan permanently as Japanese citizens could do.

You might think what is the difference between Permanent Residence and citizenship. If you get citizenship of Japan, you could also get voting right and run for public offices unlike Permanent Residents. Permanent Residents could keep their nationality while you have to give up your citizenship from your mother nations if you become Japanese citizens.

You need to get re-entry permission when you go outside of Japan as Permanent Residents. But Japanese citizens doesn' t have to get re-entry permission.

These are fundamental difference between Permanent Residence and citizenship. You need to choose which is better based on your life plan. But compared with citizenship, you could get PR in short term. When you apply for citizenship, it will take more than 1 year. While PR application takes more than 4 months.



## Where you could apply for PR



You have to go to an Immigration Services Bureau(出入国在留管理局)

You need to submit the application and attached documents to an Immigration Services Bureau.  
In Tokyo and Kanagawa, there are the following Immigration office which accept PR application.

Tokyo Regional Immigration Services Bureau (東京出入国在留管理局)

Residents of Tokyo and Kanagawa could submit the documents to the bureau.

Yokohama District Immigration Office (東京出入国在留管理局横浜支局)

Residents of Kanagawa could submit the documents to the office.

Residents of Kanagawa, Machida-shi(Tokyo), Komae-shi(Tokyo), Tama-shi(Tokyo) and Inagi-shi(Tokyo) could submit the documents.

## How to prepare for PR application

If you want to apply for PR, you need to prepare for PR in the following steps.

### 1. checking whether you meet the requirements of Permanent Residency.

You need to check whether you meet the requirements which is stated on Guideline for Permanent Residency from the Ministry of Justice. From next page, I'll write requirements of Permanent Residency for general applicants and point based system.

### 2. Collecting documents

You are also required to submit documents other than application forms. You need to collect these documents from city hall, tax office and pension office. You also need to check whether there is issues on these documents (for example you need to check whether you have unpaid tax when you collect tax payment certificate).

### 3. Choosing a guarantor

You need to find the guarantor when you apply for PR>

### 4. Submitting the documents to an Immigration Services Bureau

You also need to show your residence card and passport.

## Requirements for Permanent Residency for general applicants

As general applicant, you need to meet all of these requirements.

### 1. Good moral standards

You need to have good moral standard if you would get PR in Japan. You shouldn't have record of imprisonment and fine because of violation of Japanese law. The government of Japan want to accept foreign citizens who are good members for the community, so they ask PR applicants to have good moral standing.

Even you have not violated the law of Japan, you might be rejected if you have record of frequent records of minor violation of law and socially unacceptable acts.

### 2. Having basis or skills to sustain your independent life

If you would like to get the permission of Permanent Residence, you also need to have economical ability or basis or skills to continue your economically independent life in Japan. If you received public allowance for lower income families, you don't meet this requirement. Generally, if your annual income is lower than 3 million yen, you are unlikely to meet this requirement.

### 3. Meeting national interest

According to the guideline for Permissions of Permanent Residence from the Ministry of Justice, your residence in Japan have to meet national interest for Japan. They also published condition about national interest as followings;

- a. Living in Japan continuously for more than 10 years. you also need to have more than 5 years periods with Working VISA or Residence VISA (ex. Spouse VISA) among 10 years.
- b. Having 3 years or 5 years VISA
- c. Fulfilling obligation for payment of tax and social security and obeying law
- d. No risk of harming in terms of public sanitary
- e. No extreme risk to harm public interest

## Requirements for Permanent Residence through Point-based system

The point-based system is designed to evaluate your educational background, work experience, age and other achievement. This is used to get Highly Skilled Professional VISA. But if you have more than 70 points or 80 points, you could get Permanent Residency earlier than general applicants. Here is the requirements for applicants through point-based system.

### 1. Good moral standards

You need to have good moral standard if you would get PR in Japan. You shouldn't have record of imprisonment and fine because of violation of Japanese law. The government of Japan want to accept foreign citizens who are good members for the community, so they ask PR applicants to have good moral standing.

Even you have not violated the law of japan, you might be rejected if you have record of frequent records of minor violation of law and socially unacceptable acts.

### 2. Having basis or skills to sustain your independent life

If you would like to get the permission of Permanent Residence, you also need to have economical ability or basis or skills to continue your economically independent life in Japan. If you received public allowance for lower income families, you don't meet this requirement. Generally, if your annual income is lower than 3 million yen, you are unlikely to meet this requirement.

### 3. Meeting national interest

If you have more than 70 points now...

#### a. Meeting one of these conditions.

1. Living in Japan as Highly Skilled Professional who have 70 points for 3 years (Highly skilled Professional VISA holder Who is recognized to have more than 70 points) or;

2. Having more than 70 points 3 years before from the date application of Permanent Residency is submitted (Non-Highly Skilled Professional VISA holder)

b. Having longest Period of your VISA status (5 or 3 years)

c. Payment of Tax and Social Security and obeying law

d. Not harming Public Sanitary

e. Not having highly possibility of harming Public Interest

If you have more than 80 points now...

#### a. Meeting one of following conditions

1. Living in Japan as Highly Skilled Professional who have 80 points for 1 years (Highly skilled Professional VISA holder who is recognized to have more than 80 points from Immigration Services Bureau)

2. Having more than 80 points 1 years before from the date application of Permanent Residency is submitted

b. Having longest Period of your VISA status (5 or 3 years)

- c. Payment of Tax and Social Security and obeying law
- d. Not harming Public Sanitary
- e. Not having highly possibility of harming Public Interest

## How to choose guarantor for PR application

When you apply for Permanent Residency in Japan, you have to find a person who become the guarantor for your PR application. But even if you visit website of Immigration Services Agency, you can't find any detail about guarantor. Under current condition, Immigration officer accept the guarantor who have the following condition.

### 1. Japanese or Permanent Resident

The first thing you have to know is that you need to choose a Japanese citizen or Permanent Resident. Some people choose embassies of their home nations. But the Immigration Bureau rarely accept the embassies as guarantors.

### 2. Guarantor needs to earn decent income

Since the guarantor is one of the points to check your credibility of you, you need to choose the guarantor who has decent income.
